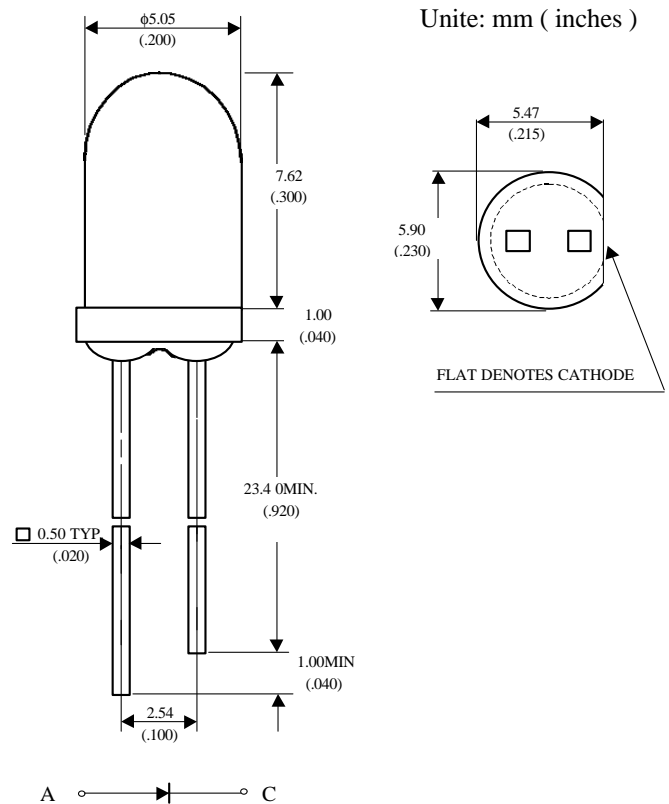
### Description

The MIE-536A2U is infrared emitting diodes in GaAs technology with AlGaAs window coating molded in pastel pink transparent package.

### Features

- High radiant power and high radiant intensity
- Standard T-1 3/4 (  $\phi$  5mm) package
- Peak wavelength  $\lambda_p = 940$  nm
- Good spectral matching to si-photodetector
- Radiant angle :  $35^\circ$

### Package Dimensions



Notes :

1. Tolerance is  $\pm 0.25$  mm (.010") unless otherwise noted.
2. Protruded resin under flange is 1.5 mm (.059") max.
3. Lead spacing is measured where the leads emerge from the package

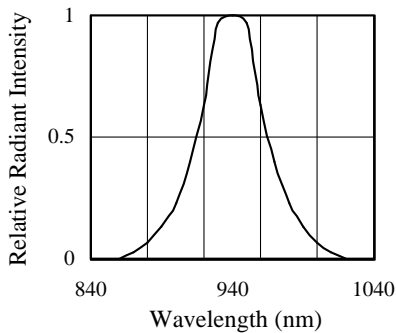


FIG.1 SPECTRAL DISTRIBUTION

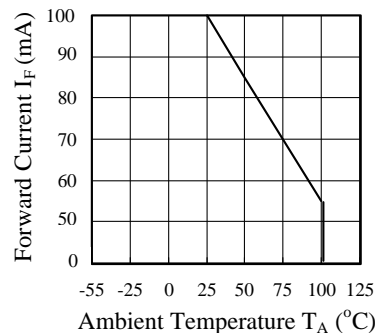


FIG.2 FORWARD CURRENT VS. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE

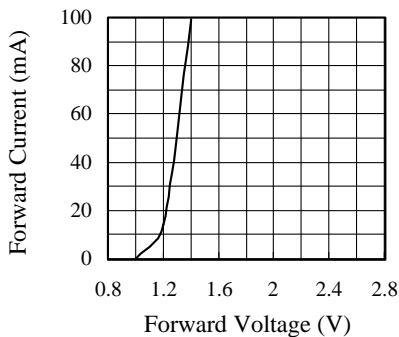


FIG.3 FORWARD CURRENT VS. FORWARD VOLTAGE

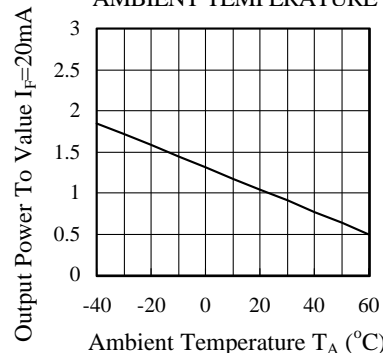


FIG.4 RELATIVE RADIANT INTENSITY VS. AMBIENT TEMPERATURE

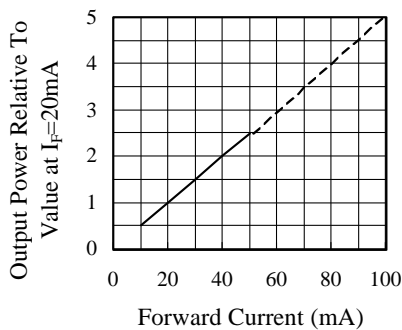


FIG.5 RELATIVE RADIANT INTENSITY VS. FORWARD CURRENT

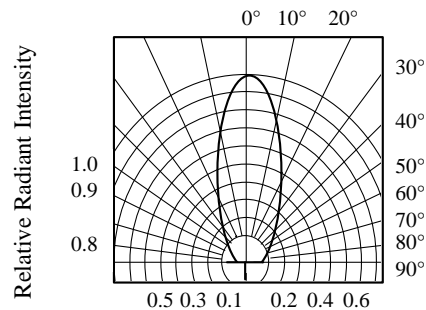


FIG.6 RADIATION DIAGRAM
